What Happens When Your Child Follows the DOGS Expectations?

When students follow the DOGS expectations, the educational plan can be implemented at its best. Teachers are able to teach in an environment conducive to teaching and students are able to learn in an environment that is comfortable and safe.

Students can also earn rewards!

- **Dog Dollars are earned by students when they follow the DOGS expectations.**
- **Dog Dollars can be spent on weekly activities such as Hat Day, Pajama Day, and Popcorn Day.**
- **Quarterly Activities:** We are in the process of planning exciting school-wide activities for our students to purchase with Dog Dollars. Students who have been referred to the office for misbehaviors will not be allowed to participate in the quarterly activities.

What Can You Do to Help Your Child Stay on the Positive Behavior Path?

- **Review the DOGS expectations with your child.**
- **Ask your child about his/her day at school every day.**
- **Make sure your child is ready for school every day. Ensure a good night's sleep.**
- **Provide a quiet time and space for your child to do homework nightly.**
- **Keep in touch with your child's teacher.**
- **Encourage your child to use appropriate language and tone.**
- **Practice positive phrases with your child, such as, "Thank you," "Excuse me," "Please," and "I'm sorry."**
- **Be a visible part of your child's school day. Attend PTO meetings and other school activities as your schedule allows.**
- **Help your child to resolve conflicts in a positive way.**
